Waldwick Band Plays on May 1st

The Waldwick Band continues its indoor concert season with a performance on Sunday, May 1st at The Village School, 100 West Prospect Street in Waldwick starting at 2:30 pm. There is no charge for admission for the performance in the school's theater style auditorium.

The program will open with *It's Music Time Again* by band member John Centenaro who composed it while group music activities were suspended during the breakout of the Covid-19 pandemic. Centenaro is a graduate of the Manhattan School of Music where he majored in clarinet, and he has performed as a vocalist and instrumentalist with numerous North Jersey ensembles. He has previously composed and arranged for the Waldwick Band and other musical groups.

Conductor Edmund A. Moderacki will lead the band in a performance of William Schuman's *George Washington Bridge*. Also on the program will be Vaughan Williams's *Sea Songs*, Keler Bela's *Lustspiel Overture*, Elmer Bernstein's *The Magnificent Seven* and music from the Broadway shows of Stephen Sondheim. A patriotic medley entitled *Broad Stripes and Bright Stars* and famous marches performed in the Waldwick Band's special style will be played.

The concert will be dedicated to the memory of Virginia Baird who performed on oboe with the band for over twenty years.
